R.E.A.C.H. Summer Day Camp is a collaboration between Oyster River Cooperative School District and Durham Parks & Recreation Department to provide exceptional opportunities for our ORCSD students. R.E.A.C.H. is a community-based summer camp experience for local youth, which meets Monday- Thursday. This summer R.E.A.C.H. will meet at Mast Way Elementary School.

Both morning and afternoon camp will take place primarily outdoors, with indoor space options during times of inclement weather.

Campers participate in a morning ORCSD program, and then have the option to transition to afternoon camp with Durham Parks & Recreation. Registration for both a morning camp and afternoon camp is required for full day attendance. Register for our local Friday Field Trips to complete the week!
